From the Pastor's Corner Blog

Hello All,

This morning I had to perform a dreaded task; I had to go to the Registry of Motor Vehicles. My oldest son Josiah turned 16 last week. Ann and I want to get him driving as soon as possible. For this to happen he needs to get his permit. A necessary first step in this process is going to the RMV. My lack of enthusiasm for the RMV is in no way unique. I don't think anyone enjoys going there.



My past experiences indicate that this lack of enthusiasm is felt just as strongly by the people that work at the RMV as it is by those who have to go there to accomplish some task. I have found the workers to be dismissive, condescending, and rude in other ways.

As I sat waiting for my number to be called I was prepared for an unpleasant interaction. When I did get called up to speak with an RMV representative I was pleasantly surprised. She was matter of fact but also pleasant and helpful. I noticed a screen to the left of her desk with a cute dog on it. I asked if it was hers, she confirmed it was. She answered several questions from me and asked several of her own. Within a few minutes Josiah and I were on our way.

The business of the RMV is inherently unpleasant. Few people are excited to show up at a place that requires specific paperwork and fees that can limit a person's ability to drive. I think the people that run the RMV are probably aware this is the case.

I would bet they set up the computer screens that I saw the worker's dog on for this exact reason. The screen is a means of humanizing the employee that would otherwise be viewed as the face of an organization that nobody particularly likes.

The Bible tells us to love our enemies. One of the best ways to facilitate that action is to learn more about them. When you get to know someone it is often more difficult to think of them in a purely negative light.

Meditation Verses: Matthew 5:43"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Recap of May 2nd Prayer Service at First Baptist Church of Rowley by Angie F. Estevez

On May 2nd, eight members from our church joined about twelve parishioners from First Baptist Church of Rowley at a prayer service, one night before the National Day of Prayer.

Pastor Ed opened up with prayer, we sang a hymn and then Pastor Ed gave us instructions on praying through a prayer list that he distributed to all of us before we broke off into four separate groups.



All four groups were tasked with praying through each prayer point (out loud in their respective group). After we prayed through that list, we were encouraged to lift up some of our own prayer requests. The group I was in, was primarily made up of people from our church (Eric, Pam, Kay, Stu and I). In addition to lifting up some of our own prayer requests, we also lifted up requests that were specific to our church.

After the four groups finished, we reconvened for one final group prayer and hymn. The service was about an hour long.

I've included the prayer list we used for your reference. It offers some important prayer points, especially in light of National Prayer Day and its emphasis on praying for government.


